Literacy and ESL

 - Free reading passages and reading comprehension exercises
 - Curriculum is aligned with Common Core State Standards and the standards of all 50 states
- California Distance Learning Project (cdlponline.org)
 - Adults can learn about a variety of topics from law and government to health and safety through reading and listening to newspaper articles
- Literacy Net (literacynet.org/cnnsf/archives.html)
 - Similar to California Distance Learning Project in that adults learn through reading newspaper articles; topics offered are slightly different, ranging from adventure and environment to politics and religion
